Rectum • OB ⁹Hard, knotty stools. *Constipation*. It is popular to carry the fruit in breeches-pocket, as a preventive of piles.

Back • OB ⁹Great lameness and weakness of back.

Lower • OB ⁹Trembling. Strong tendency to contraction of legs.

Relations • *Compare*: *Aesc.*; *Aloe*; *Coll.*; *Ign.*; *Nux-v.*

AESCULUS HIPPOCASTANUM

Aesc.

Aesculus hippocastanum. Common horse-chestnut. Sapindaceae.

Generals • The action of this drug is most marked on the lower bowel, producing engorged haemorrhoidal veins, & characteristic backache, with absence of actual constipation. Much pain but little bleeding. Venous stasis general, varicose veins of purple colour; everything is slowed down, digestion, heart, bowels, etc. The back aches and gives out and makes patient unfit for business. Torpor and congestion of liver and portal system, & constipation. Flying pains all over. *Fullness in various parts* [⁶as if they contained too much blood]; dry, swollen mucous membranes. Throat with haemorrhoidal conditions. ²Reflex rectal symptoms. *Hot, dry, stiff, rough or full feeling internally*; throat, *anus*, etc. Pains, sticking; like hot lightning. ⁴Piles rarely bleed. ⁶Feels faint, weak, and weary. Disposition to stretch and yawn. ⁹Sore feeling of muscles, mornings on awaking and on motion. Can't control muscles to speak or to write. Haemorrhoids < winter, > summer. Sensation like hot lightning. ¹⁰Tearing in back, r. side and shoulders. Pain on walking; walking erect. Soreness; on motion; on waking; of arm, back, lower limbs, < small of back; morning on waking, < calves, thighs, back, shoulders, neck, upper limbs and chest. Fullness; of dependent parts. Heart, lungs, stomach and brain feel as if too full of blood. Malaise; & dull stupefying feeling in head. Disinclined to rise after waking. Weakness; from walking; in joints; as from walking far. Joints stiff. Amelioration from eructation.

Mind • Depressed and *irritable*; ⁹unable to fix his attention. ⁶Gloomy; despondent. ⁷Unconsciousness on waking from dream. Dullness, sluggishness, *on waking in morning*; on waking at night. Mistakes in localities. ⁹On waking knows not where she is nor whence came the objects around her. Inward cheerfulness and placidity of temper. Extremely irritable; loses temper easily, and gains control over it but slowly. Feels miserably cross. ¹⁰Clearness, & light feeling in anterior lobes, but heaviness and dullness in occiput. Feeling as if death were impending during darting pain in trachea, followed by exalted condition of brain and nervous system. Disinclination to work. Gloomy forebodings. Memory lost. Thoughts rapid.

Vertigo • When sitting and walking. ⁹Slight while sitting, < rising from seat. With sensation as if he had to balance the head.

Head • SE Dull, confused, aching as from a cold. ⁶Confused, & vertigo ⁹Board on head, < rising from seat. Head would burst. Back of head as if heavy. Number of pin-points inserted in skin of vertex. ¹⁰Bruised, & lameness in nape. PA Pressure in forehead, & nausea, followed by stitches in r. hypochondrium. From occiput → frontal region, & bruised sensation of scalp; < morning. Neuralgic stitches from r. → l. across forehead [⁹& constrictive feeling in skin of forehead] followed by flying pains in epigastrium. ²Crushing in occiput. ⁹Frequent flying pains through temples. Dull, in occiput & flushes of heat over occiput, neck and shoulders. Dull aching, in occiput → frontal region. Soreness of side of scalp rested on [r.]. Severe lancinating, at base of brain, as if too full. Dull, heavy, deep in brain. Aching in back part of head, & heaviness in forehead. Extending through head from one temporal region to other, & sensation of fullness in head and beating of temporal arteries, < stooping, laughing and study.

Burning, in back part of head. Stitches in r. side of head, r. breast and anterior part of r. thigh simultaneously. ¹⁰Pressure and fullness vertex. OB ⁹Hyperaesthesia of scalp. ¹⁰Red spot on forehead from pressure of hat.

Eyes • SE Eyes heavy and hot; & lachrymation, & *enlarged bloodvessels*. PA Eyeballs sore. ⁶Painful aching over l. eye. ⁹ Burning and stinging deep in l. orbit, as if pain surrounded eyeball; ¹⁰& coldness in eye. ¹⁰Pain, light and giddy in r. eye when near light. Burning in inner canthi. OB ⁹Pupils dilated; contract slowly. Twitching of lids; of muscles under l. eye. ¹⁰Tries to keep from winking.

Vision • ⁹Can read well at a distance, can now read without spectacles. Flickering.

Ears • SE ⁹Fullness in ears. PA ⁹Burning in ears; pressure; ringing in r. ear. Severe, in r. mastoid region.

Nose • SE ⁹Formication on nose. PA Pressure [⁴fullness] at root of nose. ⁶Stinging and burning in posterior nares and soft palate. OB Dry; inspired air feels cold, *nasal passages sensitive to it*; ⁹= burning, rawness [³in nostrils] and fluent coryza and sneezing. *Coryza*, sneezing. Membrane over turbinate bones distended and boggy [¹¹obstruction of nose], dependent upon hepatic disorders. ²Congestive catarrh. ⁶Dryness of posterior nares; ⁹and throat. ¹⁰Coryza & pressure in forehead, esp. at root of nose; fluent, & frontal headache; fluent, & twisting in front part of nose.

Face • PA ⁹Stitches in l. malar bone. Severe neuralgic, from upper lip, → around r. side of head. OB ⁴Pale and sickly looking. ⁵Pale and apt to swell on washing; ⁹rubbing = red spots. ⁹Flying heat and redness of l. side of face. Lips hot. ¹⁰Flushed after rubbing. Pale, miserable appearance. Twitching of muscles under l. eye. Parotid glands sore when exposed to wind.

Mouth • SE Tongue as if scalded; ¹⁰& constriction of fauces. Metallic taste; ⁹sweet; bitter; oily or coppery, & salivation. Tip of tongue as if ulcerated. Mouth dry, as if excoriated or constricted. ¹⁰Taste like liquorice; slimy. PA ¹⁰Scraping, irritation or burning, → stomach. OB Salivation. Tongue thickly coated [⁶white or yellow]. ⁹Can't control tongue so as to form words rightly; ¹⁰uncontrollable, causing inability to speak long words distinctly. Thick yellow mucus in mouth.

Teeth • SE ⁹Covered with oil. PA ⁹Shooting in lower molars. Aching in middle lower molar < pressing teeth together.

Throat • SE ⁹Pricking in fauces; pressure as if something had lodged there; = constant inclination to swallow. Throat dry and stiff when swallowing. ¹⁰Inspired air feels cooler. PA Hot, *dry*, raw [⁶as from taking cold], stitching pain → ears when swallowing. Constriction [Bapt.]; & dull pain on each side of tonsils. Burning; when swallowing. Pain > eating a grape; sharp, biting; as if burnt. OB *Veins in pharynx distended* and tortuous. Follicular pharyngitis & hepatic congestion; ⁴& gastric and hepatic derangements. Throat sensitive to inspired air; feels excoriated and constricted, burns like fire on swallowing, in afternoon. Early stages of atrophic pharyngitis in dried-up, bilious subjects. Hawking of ropy mucus of sweetish taste. ²*Frequent inclination to swallow & burning, pricking, stinging and dry constricted fauces*. ⁹Tonsils dark, congested, swollen; < l. ¹⁰Dryness [Bell.]; after eating; increase of dry feeling, then secretion of mucus; with contraction. Swallowing difficult; inclined to swallow, & dryness and stiffness in throat [Bell.].

Food & Drink • Weight of a stone [²in pit], & gnawing, aching pain; most manifest about 3 hours after meals. ⁵Nausea from tea. ⁹Loss of appetite. Considerable thirst. Aching in middle lower molar, < warm drinks, > holding cold water in mouth. Stomach feels full, as if walls were thick, after eating; a distended feeling the only sign which tells him to stop. Burning in stomach and feeling as if about to vomit, > dinner.

Pain in stomach, continuing until he eats again. Heartburn and gulping up of food after eating. ¹⁰Appetite increased; & sick feeling in stomach.

Stomach • SE ⁹Gnawing and emptiness in stomach in early morning. Fluttering, faintness in stomach. Pressure as from a stone in pit. Periodical tightness in pit & laboured breathing. ¹⁰Burning; as if it contained water. Twisting at pit. PA ⁴Pain → liver. ⁶Constant, severe aching from pit → r. lobe of liver. ¹⁰Aching and rumbling; aching → downward. Burning, in epigastric region, and in umbilical region, & aching in lumbar region, < walking. Burning, in cardiac portion. OB ⁶Eruclations of wind; empty. ⁹Desire to vomit [²violent vomiting] & constant distress and burning. Eructations: sour; greasy; bitter; taste of food; thick mucus. Nausea & increase of saliva and slight burning in stomach.

Abdomen • SE Fullness. PA Tenderness and fullness in region of liver. Dull aching in liver and epigastrium. At umbilicus. ⁹In region of spleen. Pinching, in r. hypochondrium & colic; pain → back on inspiring. Cutting in r. inguinal region. Flatulent or flying, in bowels. Cutting in bowels before stool. Throbbing. ¹⁰Cramp-like contraction before stool. Gripping at each inspiration. Pinching before stool. Pain # pain in chest. Pain → small of back; flying. Pinching below umbilicus. OB Jaundice; & throbbing in hypogastrium and pelvis [²deep in abdomen]. ⁹Congestion of liver and portal system. Rumbling in bowels & cutting about navel, distension and bearing down. Rumbling and abdominal pain extending downward. Inguinal hernia. Abdomen tender and sore to touch. ¹⁰Distension > general sweat.

Rectum • SE Full of small sticks. Mucous membrane as if swollen and obstructing passage of stool; ¹⁰and as if rectum would protrude if effort were continued. ³Foreign body in rectum, & fruitless efforts at evacuation and pains through hips and sacrum. ⁶Anus protruding after stool. ⁹Something passing off all the time, & soreness of rectum. Bug creeping out of anus. Swollen, & constant but ineffectual urging. Gut as if turned inside out. In haemorrhoids, like a knife sawing up and down, could not sit, stand or lie, only possible position was kneeling. PA Much pain after stool, & prolapse. *Burning in anus & chills up and down back.* ²Long after stool. ³Stool followed by fullness of rectum and intense pain in anus for hours. ⁹Intolerable burning, itching, stinging, at anus, & feeling of fullness, only > rubbing or pressure; only felt while walking. OB Dry, aching. Anus raw, sore. *Haemorrhoids*, & sharp shooting pains up back; blind and bleeding; < climacteric. Large, hard, dry stools. Irritation caused by ascarides and aids their expulsion. ²Stools hard, dry; of several colours. *Piles, purple, painful, external* [& *backache* [Nux-v.], chest pains, etc.]; ⁹pain < standing on feet and walking; ¹piles seldom bleed. Constipation; hard, dry, knotty, white stools; ³large stool voided with difficulty and followed hours with severe pain in back, lumbar or sacral region. ³Large haemorrhoids, which block up rectum, without much haemorrhage. ⁹Fetid flatus. Stools mushy, light brown; first part hard, black, the last of about natural consistency, but white as milk. Dryness and itching in rectum, & feeling of stiffness of skin and adjacent cellular tissues. Sudden urging, preceded by passage of flatus and followed by pain in abdomen and eructations tasting of ingesta. Prolapsus ani during or after stool. Rubbing = flow of blood to anus.

Urinary • PA In kidneys, esp. l. and ureter [⁹from below upward]. ⁹Terrible, in region of kidney, < motion. Shooting in l. kidney. Scalding, through urethra during urination. OB Frequent, scanty, dark, muddy, hot urine. ⁶Yellow urine with thick mucous sediment. ⁹Urine passed during day, deep red with strong odour.

Male • SE ⁹Testes as if sore; itch. PA ⁹Transient, in genitals. Drawing in l. testis; from r. testis → spermatic cord. Dull and heavy shooting, through penis. Shooting, in r. testis. OB Discharge of prostatic fluid at stool ⁸and urination. ⁹Seminal emissions & amorous dreams.

Female • PA *Constant throbbing behind symphysis pubis* [³in *hypogastrium*]. OB Leucorrhoea, & *lameness of back across sacroiliac articulation* ⁹and aching in knees; dark yellow, sticky, corroding; < after menses. ³Old cases of leucorrhoea increased by walking, corroding labia. *Uterine troubles & constant backache across hips and sacrum*, < *walking or stooping*. ⁹Sacroiliac symphysis gives out while walking, during pregnancy; must sit down; still > lying; & haemorrhoids.

Larynx • SE ⁹Glottis and laryngo-pharyngeal mucous membrane as if dry and stiff. PA ⁹Throbbing, darting, in trachea, = titillation. OB Laryngitis; coughs *depending on hepatic disorders*; hot feeling in chest. ⁹Hoarse voice.

Respiration • ⁹Rapid, laboured, & pain in r. lung.

Cough • ⁴Dry, tickling, from larynx or fauces. ⁹Dry, short, < swallowing and deep breathing; dry, hacking, caused by constriction of fauces, & irritation of epiglottis. Chronic, & emaciation.

Sputum • ⁴Sweetish, ropy. ⁹Spits blood on getting up in morning.

Chest • SE ⁶Raw. ⁹Lungs engorged, heavy. Lungs as if sore, & great rush of blood, after a full breath. Hot, in chest & cold rising, as after peppermint. Lower part of chest as if constricted. Lung as if moving up and down painfully, on r. side, with each respiration. Piece torn out of sternum. Tightness of chest. PA ⁶In r. lung on motion when breathing. ⁹Stitches through chest; stitches go from l. to r. side. In chest and scapula on inhaling. In chest # pain in abdomen. OB ¹⁰Twitching, → l. shoulder.

Heart • PA Around heart in haemorrhoidal subjects. ⁹Darting, in region of heart, & fullness and palpitation. Frequent stitches and shooting, < breathing, 4 p.m. Neuralgic, so severe as to arrest breath. OB Heart's action full and heavy, can feel pulsations all over. ⁶Twitching over region of heart. Functional disturbances of heart from haemorrhoidal complaints. ⁹Severe periodical palpitation, & great anguish.

Back • SE Lameness in neck; aching between scapulae; region of *spine feels weak*; back and legs give out. Lumbar region will break, has to make repeated efforts at rising. ³*Weak, at sacroiliac symphysis, as if legs were about to give out*. ⁹Chilly, followed by pain in lumbar region, < pressure. Lumbar region as if lame and sore. ¹⁰Lameness and strained, in r. lumbar region, → gluteal muscle. PA *Backache affecting sacrum and hips*; < *walking and stooping*. ²*Laming, dull lumbar pain*. ⁴From nape to sacrum. ⁶Tearing, in lumbar region and hips when walking. While the characteristic backache is commonly associated with haemorrhoids, it may also indicate the drug in lumbago. ⁹In r. scapula and chest < inhaling. With aching in legs and knees. Pains attending curvature of spine. ¹⁰Aching in sacrum and hips [Berb.], < walking and stooping; making it difficult to get up after sitting. In mall of back and hips when getting up, > motion. OB ²*Lumbar region gives out*. ⁵The back gives out and makes one unfit for business. ⁹Cervical glands sensitive, slightly swollen. Stiffness in muscles of back. Heat in back of neck and shoulders. Back stiff, when moving.

Limbs • SE ⁹Limbs heavy. PA ⁹Darting and shooting, most on l. side. OB Hands and feet swell, and become red after washing, feel full. ⁹Joints stiff, aching and painful. Muscular spasms.

Upper • SE ⁹Right arm paralyzed, can't raise it. Left upper arm and shoulder feel as if one had taken violent exercise. Pricking, swollen, hands after washing them. Ulnar nerve as if compressed. PA Aching and soreness in limbs, in l. acromion process & shooting down arms; fingertips numb. ⁹Pains → fingers or fingertips. OB ⁹Left arm and hand much warmer, feel heavy and swollen. Nails blue. Strange trembling of muscles of l. shoulder, followed by sore sensation. Twitches in l. arm. Hands weak, can't control muscles well when writing. Cracking of skin on hands.

Lower • SE Soles feel sore, tired, and swell. ⁹Calves as if sore. Tension and soreness in l. ankle. PA ⁶Knees ache. Achilles tendon sore. ⁹Constant aching, in r. hip-joint, pain → downward. Shooting down r. thigh. Stinging on anterior part of r. thigh, just above knee. In morning, pain in r. knee and leg, as after violent exercise. Wandering. Burning, in l. great toe. ¹⁰Limbs ache when weight of body rests on them; legs ache; weak; calves sore. OB When walking feet turn under. ⁶Legs so weak she can hardly walk. ⁹Stiffness of knee-joints, esp. when rising from a seat. Feet swell after walking.

Sleep • ⁹Disposition to stretch and yawn. Drowsy; falls asleep; on awaking, knows not where she is. Awakened by burning pain in stomach. Sore and tired in morning on awaking. Sleepless from thoughts continually crowding on mind.

Dreams • ¹⁰Distressing; that he is fighting in a battle; seeing a man in his room.

Fever • ⁹Intermittent.

Chill • At 4 p.m. Up and down back; ⁹& burning in anus. ⁹Chilly from cold air. Cold air: teeth chatter and skin feels chilly. Heat of stove >. Can't get warm.

Heat • From 7 to 12 p.m. In evening, skin hot and dry; ⁹& burning palms and soles. ⁹Flushes, over occiput, face, neck and shoulders. Feverish pulsations, & hot and dry hands.

Sweat • Profuse and hot, during fever. ⁹On head and face.

Skin • ⁹Itching of body, esp. about waist. Formication: scalp, nose, fauces. ¹⁰Fullness, as from too much blood in body.

Modalities • *Worse*: Morning, on awaking. From any motion. Lying, stooping, after stools; urinating. Cold air, and after washing in water. Winter. Standing. ¹After eating. Afternoon. *Better*: Cool; open air; bathing. Bleeding [piles]; kneeling. Continued exertion. Summer. ⁸Walking greatly < all symptoms. Cold air and cold seasons <; nose and throat very sensitive when inhaling cold air; < washing. > Summer; < winter [haemorrhoids].

Conditions • ⁶Suitable in persons with haemorrhoidal tendency, and who suffer from gastric, bilious or catarrhal troubles.

Relations • *Compare*: Aloe; Coll.; Kali-bi. [throat; but Aesc. has not the stringy mucus]; Merc.; Nux-v.; Phyt. [follicular pharyngitis; ¹throat dry, more often in acute cases]; Podo.; Sulph. [weakness of back]; ⁶Bapt.; Bell.; Berb.; Bry.; Dios.; ³Ign., Mur-ac., Nit-ac., Nux-v. and Sulph. [haemorrhoids]; ¹Aesc-g.; Neg. *Follows well*: Coll.; Nux-v.; Sulph. *Antidoted by*: Nux-v. [pile symptoms]. ⁸*Complementary*: Carb-v.; Lach.; Mur-ac.

AETHIOPS ANTIMONIALIS

Aethi-a.

Double sulphuret of antimony and mercury.

Generals • Often more effective than Aethi-m. in scrofulous eruptions, glandular swellings, otorrhoea and *scrofulous eye affections*, corneal ulcers. ¹¹Artificial mixture of equal parts ethiops mineral [HgS; black mercuric sulphide] and antimony; or alternatively of triturating 2 parts of antimonous trisulphide [antimony crudum] with elemental mercury. Obsolete empirical preparation prescribed at one time for scrofulous eruptions, glandular swellings, otorrhoea, scrofulous eye affections, and corneal ulcers.

AETHIOPS MERCURIALIS MINERALIS

Aethi-m.

Black mercuric sulphide. Ethiops mineral. HgS.

Generals • This preparation is of use in *scrofulous* affections, ophthalmia, otorrhoea, painful, irritating, scabby eruptions, hereditary syphilis.

TEUCRIUM MARUM VERUM**Teucr.**

Teucrium marum. Cat thyme. Lamiaceae.

Generals • Nasal and rectal symptoms marked. *Polyps*; ²nose, vagina, ear, etc. Over-sensitiveness. *Desire to stretch*. A remedy of first importance in chronic nasal catarrh with atrophy; large, offensive crusts and clinkers. *Ozaena*. *Loss of sense of smell*. ²Affects *nose*; *lungs*; *rectum*; fingertips; toe joints. Delicate and sensitive. Internal tremors; < excitement. ⁴Longing for motion in open air, which doesn't fatigue him, but seems to do him good. ⁸When too much medicine has produced an oversensitive condition and remedies fail to act. No remedy meets more cases of threadworms than *Teucr*. *Teucr* has a relation to new growth in general as well as of the nose. It has removed a fibrous tumour of the eyelid; urethral granulations following gonorrhoea; and also uterine fibroids. ⁹Nervous affections & trembling sensation in whole body. After lesions where tetanus might be expected. Polyps in ear and nose, esp. among old and middle aged women.

Mind • Excited, tremulous feeling. ⁶Irresistible desire to sing. ⁷Irritability after dinner. Anger from voices of people. Cheerful in open air. *Excitement after hearing horrible things*. *Excitement during perspiration*. *Loquacity during heat*. Narrating her symptoms <. Somnambulism. *Talking of unpleasant things* <; ⁹= chilliness. *Weeping* <. ⁸State of irritability, and irascibility, with sensitiveness so great that fatigue is produced by merely hearing the conversation of others. Indolence, and great aversion to exertion, either mental or physical. Excessive moral excitement and loquacity. Great irritability and nervous excitement, & trembling [sensation in whole body], and dizziness. ¹⁰Longing for motion in open air, where he is in constant motion without weariness, & joy. Exaltation towards evening, & inclination to talk much and & bodily heat. Fretfulness; during and after dinner, & pressure in forehead.

Vertigo • ¹⁰Dizziness; and on walking he puts one foot over the other and reels.

Head • PA ⁴Painful pressure in r. temple, # painful pressure in r. frontal eminence, and in l. temple. ⁹Repeated attacks of pain in forehead, & stuffing up of nose, > thick, dirty yellow, offensive smelling discharge. Pressing, over eyes, < stooping. OB Strengthens brain after delirium tremens. ⁹Skin of forehead sensitive to touch. Injuries to head; concussion of brain.

Eyes • SE ⁸Sand in eyes; ¹⁰in r. PA Smarting in [⁸internal] canthi. OB Lids red and puffy; tarsal tumour [*Staph.*]. ⁶Eyes look watery as if from weeping. ⁹Profuse smarting lachrymation in open air.

Ears • SE Hissing and ringing. ⁹Hissing sound when passing hand over ear, when talking or forcibly inspiring through nose. Fine ringing in r. ear, when blowing nose, squeaking as if air were forced through mucus. PA ⁴Earache & shooting pain. OB ²Itching of ears. ⁹Polyps. Dry herpes, & white scales, on and behind ears.

Nose • SE ⁹Right nostril as if partly stopped; must blow nose and sneeze, but couldn't thereby remove obstruction. PA ⁴Shooting tearing high up in nose. ⁹Painful formication and shooting at root of nose, in l. frontal sinus. OB Catarrhal condition of both anterior and posterior nostrils. *Mucous polypus*. Chronic catarrh; *discharge of large, irregular clinkers*; ⁹leaving nose sore. Coryza, & stoppage of nose; ²< side lain on. ²Loss of smell. *Crawling in nose*; *must pick it*; lumpy discharge. Solid lumps from posterior nares. ³Child frequently rubs its nose. ⁶Violent crawling in r. nostril, & lachrymation of r. eye. ⁸Fluent coryza in open air. ⁹Continued stoppage of nose after removal of polyps. Copious flow of mucus from l. nostril. Polypus enlarges in wet weather. Both sides of nose very much obstructed on reading aloud, several times during day, and esp. in evening. Couldn't

blow her nose without acute pain and some bleeding; polypus. Tingling in nose; frequent sneezing with or without coryza.

Face • SE ⁹Frequent feeling of flushes of heat, but with paleness. OB ⁵Tumour of lower lip. ⁸Sickly, pale complexion, & hollow eyes. ⁹Pale face. Burning itching rash on upper part of face and on forehead, < evening and warmth. Deep furrow on either side of lower lip, with elevated edges.

Mouth • SE ⁹Biting, as from pepper on l., afterwards on r. side of root of tongue. OB Foul breath. ²Itching of palate. ⁹Much mucus and saliva.

Teeth • PA ⁴Tearing in roots and gums of r. lower incisors.

Throat • SE *Mouldy taste in throat* when hawking up mucus or coughing. ⁶Biting and scraping, posteriorly in fauces; < l. side. PA ⁹Stinging or pressure, hindering swallowing. OB Follicular pharyngitis.

Food & Drink • Unnatural appetite; ⁶prevents falling asleep. Hiccough on eating, after nursing [⁹little children, emaciated]. ⁴Flatulent symptoms, esp. cutting pains after drinking. ⁸Hunger in morning and evening. Bitter taste in gullet after eating. Cuttings or nausea, & inclination to vomit, after drinking water. ⁹Irritability during and after dinner, & pressure in forehead. Jerking hiccough and empty belching after nursing. Cutting abdominal colic after drinking [⁸beer or water]. Chilliness after eating. ¹⁰Sudden colic transversely across low down in abdomen in morning, evening, fasting or after bread, if he drinks water, or nausea as if he could not tolerate water.

Stomach • SE ⁴Anxious oppression in pit. ⁹Empty feeling and rumbling. OB Vomiting of large quantities of dark green masses [⁸mucus]. Constant hiccough, & pain in back. ⁴Eructation of food, & bitter taste.

Abdomen • PA ⁶Dull pressure, as from incarcerated flatus. ⁸Colic, with tearing drawings, under hypochondria. ⁹Pressing, drawing from abdomen → cords and testes.

Rectum • OB *Itching of anus and constant irritation in evening in bed. Ascarides & nightly restlessness.* Crawling in rectum after stool. ²*Itching of anus; prevents sleep.* Pinworms. ⁶Frequent noiseless emission of warm flatus. ⁸Expulsion of much flatus, having smell of rotten eggs. ⁹Diarrhoea, & crying and emaciation in children.

Urinary • SE ⁸Distressing, as from excoriation, and smarting in upper part of urethra. PA ⁸Burning, during and after micturition. Burning, pressing, biting in forepart of urethra when not urinating. OB ⁶Increased discharge of pale, watery urine.

Male • SE ¹⁰Testes as if squeezed. PA ⁸Drawing, behind l. side of root of penis, → l. side of scrotum, became sore to touch. OB ⁹Sexual desire decreased.

Female • OB ⁹Vaginal polyp, smooth, pedunculated, pear-shaped.

Larynx • SE ¹⁰Trachea as if coated, beginning with dryness, compelling constant hawking of mucus. OB ⁹Dryness, = hawking. Dryness in trachea.

Respiration • ⁹Catarrhal asthma, esp. in the aged. Hissing sound on inhaling.

Cough • Dry, tickling in trachea; expectoration profuse. ⁸Dry, from tickling in trachea, as if dust had been inspired [which is < coughing].

Chest • SE ⁹Oppression, without affecting breathing. PA ⁹Stitches in r. chest when inhaling. ¹⁰Pinching in lower part on bending backward when sitting, > bending forward, & pain beneath l. ribs close to spine. Pinching in lower part, always > walking, and in pit of stomach, → chest and abdomen and causing anxious discomfort.

Back • PA ⁸Burning in l. scapula. Rheumatic drawing and tension in back.

Limbs • SE ⁹Limbs go to sleep, & tingling, when sitting; ¹⁰and in morning in bed. PA Tearing, in arms and legs. ⁶Rheumatic, mostly in bones and joints; < evening, > motion. OB Affection of fingertips and joints of toes. ⁸Jerking of limbs.

Upper • SE ¹⁰Heaviness of l. arm so that it must hang down. Paralytic, at insertion of r. deltoid into humerus, < raising arm and drawing it backward, > hanging quietly or

moving moderately, but if he attempts to bend the arm down when it is raised high it loses all power and sinks down. PA ⁴Cutting, transversely through muscles of forearm. ⁹Burning in fingertips; panaritium. OB ⁹Rheumatic lameness of r. upper arm as far as elbow, it sinks down on lifting it; drawing and tearing pain in whole arm. Finger-joints bend over easily. Eruption on index finger of r. hand, covering a surface about 2 inches long and 1 inch wide, hypertrophied and covered with thick, whitish scales; psoriasis dorsalis.

Lower • SE *Toenails*, as if they had grown into the flesh. ¹⁰Tension above and in l. Achilles tendon. PA ¹⁰From middle of thighs to hollows of knees as from pressure upon sciatic nerve, if thighs rest upon chair. In front below l. knee. Paroxysmal tearing in r.

Causation • Concussion [brain]. Injuries likely to set up *Teucr.*

TEUCRIUM SCORODONIA

Teucrium scorodonia. Woodland germander. Wood sage. Lamiaceae.

Generals • [In Boericke under Relations of *Teucrium marum verum*]: Tuberculosis & muco-purulent sputum. Dropsy. Orchitis and *tuberculous epididymitis*, esp. in young, thin individuals with tuberculosis of lungs, glands; bones and uro-genitals, 3x. ⁸Martiny introduced *Teucr-s.* into his practice and used a tisane of it with much success in bronchorrhoea and consumptive affections with tuberculous elements and muco-purulent expectoration. I have, myself, confirmed this, using the mother tincture in 5 or 10-drop doses 2 or 3 times a day. Criquelion points out that *Teucrium-s.*
